

Street dedication ceremony honors fallen veterans

CHULA VISTA - The commander of Naval Supply Systems Command Global Logistics Support (NAVSUP GLS) gave the keynote address at a ceremony in Chula Vista in honor of seven local fallen veterans, May 26.

Rear Adm. James McNeal joined Chula Vista Mayor Mary Casillas Salas and more than 200 members of the community, including families of the honorees, as the city announced new streets to be named after local service members killed in operations in Afghanistan and Iraq.

The roads were named for:

- Salem Bachar, a Marine Corps corporal who died at age 20 in a 2006 battle in Fallujah, Iraq;
 - Michael Idanan, 21, an Army specialist killed in 2005 when a roadside bomb exploded near his Humvee south of Mosul, Iraq;
 - Kristofferson Lorenzo, a 33-year-old Army staff sergeant who died in 2011 when a device exploded in Kunar province, Afghanistan;
 - Michael Martinez, 24, a Army sergeant killed in combat in 2007 in Baghdad;
 - Joshua Mattero, a 29-year-old Army staff sergeant who died in 2007 when a device he was trying to defuse exploded northeast of Baghdad;
 - Curtis Spivey, 25, a Army specialist who died in 2007 of wounds suffered in an explosion in Baghdad the previous year; and
 - Charles Wyckoff Jr., 28, a sergeant with the Army's 82nd Airborne Division, killed by gunfire while on patrol in Afghanistan.
- "Today, we honor these seven men; local sons from our community who sacrificed their lives in service to our country," said McNeal. "May Americans for generations to come silently honor these patriots as they walk these streets."

As Rear Adm. McNeal told the story of each of the men, master of ceremonies and Chula Vista Deputy Mayor John McCann presented their family members with commemorative street signs.

The streets are in the Montecito Village development in Otay Ranch area of Chula Vista.

Historic ICBM intercept test sends strong message to North Korea

WASHINGTON - A monumental intercept test for the United States' critical homeland defense system designed to defend against intercontinental ballistic missile threats from North Korea and Iran was a success, the Missile Defense Agency announced May 30 shortly after the test.

As North Korea's missile capabilities continue to grow, successful tests of the Ground-based Midcourse Defense System that are specifically designed to go up against those possible missile threats are imperative, defense officials have said.

The test marks the first time the Ground-based Midcourse Defense system has gone up against an ICBM-class target, although some previous tests have featured intermediate-range ballistic missile targets that have approached ICBM speeds.

During the test conducted by the MDA in cooperation with the U.S. Air Force 30th Space Wing, an ICBM-class target was launched from the Reagan Test Site on Kwajalein Atoll in the Republic of the Marshall Islands, according to an MDA statement released shortly after the test.

A ground-based interceptor was launched from Vandenberg Air Force Base, California. As designed, "its exo-atmospheric kill vehicle intercepted and destroyed the target in a direct collision," the statement reads.

CARAT 2017 series begins

SATTAHIP, Thailand - The 23rd annual Cooperation Afloat Readiness and Training (CARAT) exercise series between the Royal Thai Navy and the U.S. Navy and Marine Corps commenced here May 29.

As the premier naval engagement in South and Southeast Asia, CARAT provides a regional venue to address shared maritime security priorities, enhance interoperability among participating forces, and develop sustained naval partnerships with nations across South and Southeast Asia.

"Our engagement through CARAT provides the U.S. and Thailand an opportunity to strengthen our alliance and maritime partnership in very meaningful ways," said Rear Adm. Don Gabrielson, commander, Task Force (CTF) 73. "The complexity of the training and the diverse cadre of Sailors and Marines allow us to deepen

relationships at all levels and create bonds of trust that span generations within our forces."

CARAT Thailand 2017 consists of eight days of shore-based and at-sea training events in multiple warfare areas. The exercise features a robust sea phase with surface warfare maneuvering tactics, small-boat operations, manned and unmanned helicopter

flight operations, communication exercises and more.

"We have another complex exercise planned this year, and I think that speaks to the strength of our partnership developed through many years of executing CARAT events together," said

Capt. Alexis Walker, deputy commodore, Destroyer Squadron 7. "Each year our planners continue to push the envelope and develop more sophisticated training events, ensuring our forces are ready to operate together and respond effectively to any crisis."

The shore phase will involve training across a range of naval competencies, including visit,

Thailand has been part of the CARAT exercise series since it began in 1995, and 2017 marks 184 years of continued diplomatic relations with the United States. This year's exercise reflects more than two decades of increasingly complex training ashore, at sea and in the air.

U.S. assets participating in CARAT Thailand 2017 include staff from CTF 73 and Commander, Destroyer Squadron 7, San Diego-based USS *Coronado*, USNS *Millinocket* (T-EPF-3), a P-3C Orion, Marines from 3rd Marine Division based in Okinawa, Coastal Riverine Group (CRG) 1, Explosive Ordnance Disposal Mobile Unit 5, and the 7th Fleet Rock Band "Orient Express."

Phases vary based on exercise locations, mutual training goals and participating assets. Many CARAT phases feature a broad range of naval competencies including surface warfare; undersea warfare; air defense and amphibious warfare; maritime security operations; riverine operations; jungle warfare; explosive ordnance disposal; combat construction; diving and salvage; search and rescue; maritime patrol and reconnaissance aviation; maritime domain awareness; military law; public affairs; military medicine; and humanitarian assistance and disaster response.

In the Philippines, CARAT will transition into a maritime training activity, focused on civil-military operations and counter-terrorism training. The maritime engagement will also include a series of subject matter expert exchanges between participating forces.

The Singapore phase of CARAT will continue in 2017 under the name Pacific Griffin and will be held in Guam, alternating back to Singapore every other year under the name CARAT Singapore. This change in yearly venues allows the two navies to advance the complexity of maritime training utilizing diverse naval platforms and training areas. While the exercise series remains bilateral at its core, additional countries will participate in select CARAT 2017 exercises making those phases trilateral or multilateral.

CARAT 2017 will continue to feature complex and relevant naval

training and security engagements. Its continuing relevance for more than two decades speaks to the high quality of exercise events and the enduring value of regional cooperation among allies and partners in South and Southeast Asia.

As 7th Fleet's executive agent for theater security cooperation in South and Southeast Asia, Commander, Task Force 73 and Destroyer Squadron 7 conduct advanced planning, organize resources, and directly support the execution of maritime exercises and engagements.

Modernization, replacement programs constitute nuclear deterrence priority

WASHINGTON - Modernization and replacement programs for elements of the U.S. nuclear triad are the first priority for the Defense and Energy departments, the Air Force and the Navy in fiscal year 2018, officials and military officers told a House panel May 25.

Testifying before the House Armed Services Strategic Force Subcommittee on the president's budget request for fiscal year 2018 were Frank Klotz, administrator of the National Nuclear Security Administration, and Dr. Rob Soofer, deputy assistant secretary of defense for nuclear and missile defense policy.

Joining them to offer testimony on 2018 priorities for nuclear forces were Air Force Gen. Robin Rand, commander of the Air Force Global Strike Command, and Navy Vice Adm. Terry Benedict, director of Navy Strategic Systems Programs.

The NNSA, which Congress established in 2000, maintains the U.S. nuclear weapons stockpile, helps reduce the global danger from weapons of mass destruction, provides the U.S. Navy with nuclear propulsion and responds internationally to nuclear and radiological emergencies.

Klotz said the NNSA budget request, which is about half of the Energy Department budget, is \$13.9 billion, nearly \$1 billion over the fiscal 2017 omnibus level. "We're very grateful for the level of spending that has been proposed in the president's [fiscal 2018] budget. It will allow us to tackle some of our very important infrastructure recapitalization projects, such as the uranium processing facility at Y-12 in Oak Ridge, Tenn.," Klotz said.

"We expect to complete design this year and actually start construction next year, he said,


adding, "We didn't get into the situation we face with aging and in some cases crumbling infrastructure overnight, and we're not going to get out of it in a day."

Klotz told the panel that the 2018 budget request is vital to ensuring that the U.S. nuclear force remains modern, robust and tailored to 21st century threats and to reassure U.S. allies. Elements of the request are as follows:

- Weapons activity appropriation: \$10.2 billion, a 10.8 percent increase over 2017.
- Defense nuclear non-proliferation: \$1.8 billion, consistent with 2017.
- Naval reactors program: Nearly \$1.5 billion, a 4.2 percent increase over 2017, and
- Federal salaries and expenses: \$418 million, an 8.1 percent over 2017.

"Our [fiscal] 2018 budget request ... accounts for the significant tempo of operations at NNSA that in many ways has reached a level unseen since the Cold War," Klotz said.

The request includes long-

overdue investments to repair and replace infrastructure at national laboratories and production plants, he added, and improves workspace for the scientific, engineering and professional workforce.

In his remarks to the panel, Soofer said that for decades U.S. nuclear forces have provided the ultimate deterrent against nuclear attacks on the United States and its allies.

Effective deterrence requires a deliberate strategy and forces that are structured and postured to support that strategy, he said, noting that "strategy, forces and

posture also must be flexible enough to maintain stability while adjusting to gradual and rapid technological and geopolitical changes."

Russia has taken aggressive actions against its neighbors, threatened the United States and is modernizing a diverse non-strategic nuclear weapons force, for example. China's increased assertiveness suggests a desire to dominate the Asia-Pacific region, and North Korea's leaders have been willing to accept economic countermeasures and international isolation to advance

its nuclear capability, he said, among other threats.

Against this backdrop, Soofer said, the president directed DoD to conduct a comprehensive Nuclear Posture Review that is expected to be completed by the end of this calendar year.

"As we conduct the NPR, [Defense Secretary Jim Mattis] has directed that we continue with the existing program of record for recapitalizing our aging nuclear forces," he said.

DoD expects nuclear recapitalization costs to total \$230 billion to \$290 billion over more than two decades, Soofer said.

"The president's budget request for [fiscal] 2018 fully funds DoD nuclear recapitalization programs and provides for nuclear force sustainment operations. It also adds more than \$3 billion across the Future Years Defense Plan relative to the previous years' request to continue improving the health of the DoD nuclear enterprise," he said.

In his remarks, Air Force Gen. Robin Rand, commander of Air Force Global Strike Command,

highlighted the need for modernization efforts across Air Force Global Strike Command.

"Fiscal constraints, while posing planning challenges, do not alter the national security landscape or the intent of competitors and adversaries," the general said. "Nor do they diminish the enduring value of long-range strategic forces to our nation."

Navy Vice Adm. Terry Benedict, director of Navy Strategic Systems Programs, addressed long-term sustainment of the triad's sea-based leg.

"While our current life-extension efforts will sustain the D-5 [Trident submarine-launched ballistic missile] system until the 2040s, the Navy is already beginning to evaluate options to maintain a credible and effective strategic weapon system to the end of the Columbia class service life in the 2080s," the Benedict said.

"At SSP we are looking long term and across the spectrum, from our workforce and infrastructure to our industry partners and geographic footprint," he added.

SHAPE, Eucom senior enlisted leaders work together

WASHINGTON - Historians estimate that between 70 million and 85 million people were killed during World War II.

It was the most destructive war in history. Europe - from the Ural Mountains to the United Kingdom - was a charnel house.

Since Victory in Europe Day - May 8, 1945 - American service members have been an integral part of the effort to guarantee peace on the European continent.

Working with allies of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, 72 years have passed without a major conflict on the continent - one of the longest periods of peace in European history.

The stability that led to that peace is threatened by Russia from the east and terrorism emanating from the Middle East and North Africa.

Army Gen. Curtis M. Scaparrotti represents U.S. military power on the continent as the commander of U.S. European Command, and represents the alliance's resolve to maintain peace as NATO's supreme allied commander for Europe.

One of the general's jobs is to ensure Eucom and NATO work together.

In this effort, Navy Fleet Master Chief Crispian Addington and Croatian Command Sgt. Major Davor Petek work together to help the general achieve his aims. Addington is the senior enlisted leader based at Eucom headquarters in Stuttgart, Germany, and Petek is the senior enlisted leader based at the Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers Europe (SHAPE) in Mons, Belgium.

"free and at peace" seemed within reach a decade ago. Then Russian aggression began, with the country invading Abkhazia and South Ossetia in the Republic of Georgia in 2008.

In November 2013, Russian President Vladimir Putin set his sights on Crimea - an autonomous province of Ukraine. In March 2014, Russia illegally annexed Crimea.

"But we constantly work together," Addington said during an interview with both men.

The missions are not too different, Petek said. NATO's and Eucom's priorities are almost the same, he said. But the two enlisted leaders work in different arenas.

The mission for both organizations is to ensure there are trained and ready troops that can deter aggression, execute operations and defend national and NATO interests.

The mission of U.S. forces in Europe and NATO has changed from one of being a headquarters focused on engagement to being focused on deterrence. Both are true warfighting commands.

The idea of a Europe "whole,

Today, separatists in eastern Ukraine, supported by Russian troops, are in battle in that region.

Russian revisionist behavior scared the nations of Europe. The Russian strategy is not quite war, but not peace either.

NATO responded and there are now multinational NATO units in the Baltic Republics and Poland. NATO allies patrol the skies and ships cruise the Baltic and Black seas.

This meant a change in posture for Eucom and SHAPE. "The last time the United States had this many troops in Europe, I was sitting on the other side of the wall," Petek said. "Here today, I'm sitting at one of the two strategic commands of NATO as the senior enlisted [leader]. The environment changed and NATO changed also."

talking to each other, learning about each other."

From a tactical perspective, enlisted troops needed to know things such as if they could talk to each other, if their radios were compatible, and what the capabilities of the partner nations' weapons systems are.

While NATO prides itself on interoperability, this is one of the few times the integration of units has been conducted at such a tactical level. "These are things that are important to enlisted [troops] to know so we can operate together," the sergeant major said.

"Apart from the strong message these [enhanced forward presence] battlegroups send to Russia of our determination to protect the NATO boundary ... it is the first time since the Cold War that we are deploying troops in these numbers," Addington said.

The fleet master chief praised the opportunities for training both within the units and with host nation units.

The enhanced forward presence battlegroups also prompts NCOs to address differences in military cultures. For example, the U.S. battlegroup in Poland initially worked with international forces that did not have an empowered senior NCO - not all militaries have a tradition of giving senior NCOs the responsibility to lead.

"Now," Petek said, "they come to a U.S. group and there is a sergeant major there, and the expectation is if you go there, you better get a senior enlisted [service member] who can work with the U.S. unit."

These nations realize there is the need to have a senior enlisted leader standing right next to the national commander because the battlegroup commander has a senior NCO standing with him, Addington said.

Both senior enlisted leaders reinforce their commander's intent wherever they go, Addington said, and the message, he added, is "95 percent the same. We want to make sure the troops are ready and able to do what they are expected to do."

There are multiple events throughout the year to engage senior NCOs. Many of them are combined events. "The international senior enlisted seminar is a major event we do every year," the fleet master chief said. The seminar brings roughly 40 senior enlisted leaders together to talk about current events and ways to build strategic partnerships.

"There are many events that may be a Eucom or a NATO event and we will both go with the boss, because we have U.S. senior leaders and NATO senior leaders and we are one team," Petek said. "There is no ego here. It's all about working together to meet the boss's mission and intent. That's the bottom line."

One aspect both men noted was the different views of enlisted troops throughout the alliance. "We have levels of, let's call it 'enlisted empowerment,' that range from 100 percent to zero because we still have nations that don't even have an NCO corps," Addington said.

NATO is not in the business of changing national systems, but there are expectations for NCOs when they arrive to take a job in a NATO unit or headquarters.

Navy pilot's remains back on U.S. soil from Vietnam after 52 years

Frederick Crosby buried May 28 at Ft. Rosecrans

SAN DIEGO - It's been a year since John Crosby found out his father's remains had finally been found. On May 26, when his father's flag-draped coffin arrives at NAS North Island, it will be nearly 52 years since Navy Lt. Cmdr. Frederick Peter Crosby was shot down in North Vietnam - on June 1, 1965.

John has one sister, Deborah, and two brothers, Douglas and Steven. John is the youngest and was only one when it happened. His eldest sibling was eight at the time.

"When someone is gone that you never met," said John Crosby, "I never really felt the loss. I did feel my mother's pain. I don't think she ever moved past it. She never spoke about it. The family never spoke about it. In high school, I didn't even know how my father died. I did some research and I think it was a year out of high school, we did a service up at Miramar."

Frederick Crosby was two weeks shy of his 32nd birthday when his RF-8A fighter jet was struck down by heavy gunfire a

few miles northeast from the city of Thanh Hóa on June 1, 1965.

"My father, a reconnaissance pilot, was flying 600 miles per hour, 300 feet from the ground because of a cloud cover," said John Crosby. "He crashed into the levee. There was a wingman there. It happened so quick, painless, he went so damn quick - that's what he was telling us."

He said the owner of the levee was standing right there when his dad crashed. "He was splashed with water and mud after the crash."

"He was the exact same age as my father. It might have been one of the bigger events in his life. He used that jet windshield to repair the clock on his mantle." He said investigators saw that clock, still on the mantle, with his dad's windshield in 2015.

"We're the only country in the world that actively searches out lost servicemen," said John Crosby. "It's amazing when you think about it. When you go to Britain, if someone comes up with something, they will look into it, but they don't actively go out and continually search for service members."

"Our government went through that and didn't stop whether we wanted it or not. My sister was

adamant that he might still be alive. DOD has family update meetings. About 15 years ago in Mission Valley, I went to one to appease my sister. I made the mistake of saying that I wish they wouldn't do this. I didn't want them disturbing anybody's life. They said to me: 'This is not about you - this is about the Navy and your father.'"

According to the National League of Families of American Prisoners and Missing in Southeast Asia, 969 missing service members have been



accounted for since the end of the Vietnam War in 1975.

On May 28, Lt. Cmdr. Frederick Crosby was buried at Fort Rosecrans National Cemetery with full military honors and a Navy flyover.

Social Security Matters

Ask Rusty - Unmarried Couple

Dear Rusty: A couple I'm friends with has lived together for over 45 years. Unfortunately, he died last week and she is unsure about what happens to his Social Security benefits now that he has passed away. She's also not sure about her own status since they were never legally married. This woman is understandably distraught and I'm trying to help her get through this difficult time. Can you help? Signed: A Friend helping a friend.

Dear Friend: You are, indeed, a good friend for helping in her time of need. Here's what you need to know: His benefits cease immediately upon his death, and Social Security should be given timely notification of his passing. Typically, this is done by the funeral home if they have been given the deceased's Social Security number, but can also be done by another trusted individual.

His benefits for the month in which he died are not payable to his survivor. For example, if he died in March the benefit received in April must be returned. If a check is received, return it (and any future checks) without cashing. If his benefits were paid by direct deposit, notify the bank to return the payment, as well as any future payments. If any of the decedent's after-death benefits are not returned, they will eventually come after them.

Even though this couple wasn't legally married, she may be entitled to survivor's benefits if she can prove to Social Security that they were in a marriage-like relationship and the state in which they resided recognizes common law marriage (state laws on common law marriage vary, and Social Security rules state that the common law marriage must have been established in a state that permits it). Proving this should start with submission to Social Security of Form SSA-754-F4 by the wife, and of Form SSA-753 by affidavits, who can be blood relatives or friends (both forms available at ssa.gov). Survivor's benefits are somewhat age-dependent, but given the length of this couple's relationship, it's safe to assume that when he died they were both at least at their full retirement age as defined by Social Security. Thus, in addition to the \$255 lump-sum death benefit, as his widow she would be entitled to 100 percent of the benefit that he was receiving.





Investigators urge vigilance as ‘sextortion’ scam continues to target Soldiers

Social media has countless benefits for Soldiers, with finding romance being one of them. But the person on the other end of that so-called love connection may be a scammer.

With ongoing cases of “sextortion” occurring across the Army -- a cybercrime where someone threatens to expose a sexual image in order to gain money or something else from a victim -- Army investigators have issued a new warning to Soldiers so they don’t fall prey to the crime.

“They know that service members often have security clearances and are held to a higher standard of conduct, so that’s why they’re vulnerable targets,” said Chris Grey, spokesman for the Army Criminal Investigation Command, or CID.

Typically, a perpetrator quickly elicits a video chat or exchanges sexually explicit images with a victim. A criminal may also try to gain the trust of a victim by pretending to share a mutual friend found on their open social media account.

“Many times, it’s a person who within just a couple of chats will immediately be in the state of undress or engaging in some type of sexual act and try to encourage the victim to do the same,” Grey said Wednesday. “It’s not like this happens months later; it’s pretty quick.”

Once the criminal has compromising images of a victim, they try to blackmail the victim with threats of posting the images online or showing them to the victim’s supervisors, friends or family members. Criminals have also been known to pose as law enforcement officials, at-

tempting to get the victim to pay a fine for exposing themselves online.

“If the victim pays, then they’re very likely to come back for more money,” Grey said, adding that Soldiers could find themselves in a never-ending cycle of demands.

While some Soldiers have handed over thousands of dollars of “hush money” in the scam, others have looked to ending their lives as a way to escape from it. There have been documented cases of Soldiers who committed suicide or attempted suicide because of it, Grey said.

Besides money, criminals may also target Soldiers to gain sensitive military information.

“They have been targeted, like other scams, because the perpetrators know that they have money and have a career and may have military information and access to military installations,” Grey said.

The scam is not just solely focused on the Army, but it also targets service members in the other branches, as well as the entire civilian population.

“It’s a widespread scam,” Grey said, “but we want to make sure the force is ready and this helps protect the force by getting the word out so our Army community doesn’t become victims.”

In the Army, the crime has mainly targeted young males, although there have been reports of female victims, investigators say.

If a Soldier or an Army civilian employee is targeted, they should not send any money to the perpetrator. Instead, they should report the crime to the

Army CID’s Computer Crime Investigative Unit at usarmy.cciuintel@mail.mil or 571-305-4478.

Family members and others not associated with the military can report the crime to their local police department, to Department of Homeland Security investigators at Assistance.Victim@ice.dhs.gov, or the FBI’s Internet Crime Complaint Center at www.ic3.gov.

To help prevent the crime, the Army CID uses social media and press releases to get the word out, while agents often give sextortion briefings across the service. The Army’s Sexual Harassment/Assault Response and Prevention program, or SHARP, also educates Soldiers about the crime as part of their regular training.

The goal of these campaigns, Grey said, is to encourage Soldiers to remain vigilant when online.

“There are perpetrators trolling the internet just like there are people on the back alleys of streets,” he said. “So [Soldiers] have to be extremely careful.”

E-5 advancement opportunity increased from 22.58 percent last cycle to 23.39 percent (.81 percentage point change) this cycle, with 8,310 quotas.

E-6 advancement opportunity increased from 12.15 percent last cycle to 14.83 percent (2.68 percentage point change) this cycle, with 3,968 quotas.

FTS advancement opportunity and quotas by pay grade are:

E-4 advancement opportunity increased from 87.97 percent last cycle to 95.35 percent (7.38 percentage point change) this cycle, with 205 quotas.

E-5 advancement opportunity decreased from 47.32 percent last cycle to 46.02 percent (-1.3

percentage points change) with 266 quotas.

E-6 advancement opportunity increased from 15.81 percent last cycle to 19.68 percent (3.87 percentage points change) this cycle, with 199 quotas.

SELRES advancement opportunity and quotas by pay grade are:

E-4 advancement opportunity decreased from 15.71 percent last cycle to 14.40 percent (-1.31 percentage point change) this cycle, with 599 quotas.

I'm not sure why we were conditioned to feel agitation when we'd hear our kids — Hayden, Anna and Lilly — roughhousing when they were younger. Even though they were only playing with each other, we knew that if the giggling was allowed to continue, eventually skin would be pinched, hair would get pulled, or heads would be bonked. Crying and yelling would ensue, usually accompanied by slapping, kicking and biting.

their lounge furniture to intervene, which is annoying, especially when a good show is on TV. Better to launch a preemptive strike, and stop the sibling interaction while it's still in the giggling phase by yelling from the recliner.

Just as Uncle Charlie was about to give dating advice to Chip, Tray popped up between my face and the television and blurted, "BOO!"

As a child, I never understood how siblings can be the best of friends and the worst of enemies. In high school, I watched my best friend Patti and her older sister Barb viciously beat each other with hangers and thought they hated each other's guts. Now, with girls of my own, I understand that the violent hanger beating was all part of sisterly love.

The age gap between my brother Tray and me was too wide for us to be regular playmates. Essentially, my very existence annoyed him, so he generally skipped the giggling phase of roughhousing.

When bored or agitated, Tray transformed into a predator, and I was his prey. He would launch sneak attacks like Cato in The Pink Panther, jumping out from dark corners to place me in headlock and chokeholds. After receiving a book on judo one Christmas, I often found myself being flipped over his

I walked with a slight limp for the next couple of weeks, but it was worth it, knowing I had finally given my big brother a dose of his own medicine.

Safe summer driving tips for teens and young adults

To help teens and young adults stay safe on the roads this summer and all year long, Cooper Tire & Rubber Company and the National Organizations for Youth Safety (NOYS) offer these tire safety tips.

• Check tire condition. Damaged tires can shorten tire life and even cause tire failure. Visually check tires for cuts, cracks, splits, punctures and bulges. If any of these conditions are spotted, or if there are any doubts about the condition of the tires, have them professionally inspected.

• Check tire pressure. Proper air pressure improves fuel consumption and helps prevent uneven wear of tires. It also offers drivers better control, which is important for those with less experience behind the wheel. More than 50 percent of American vehicles have at least one under-inflated tire, according to a Rubber Manufacturers Association survey.

To test pressure, wait until tires are cool -- a minimum of three hours after driving. Then, remove the tire's valve cap and press the top of a tire pressure gauge firmly on the valve stem. A reading will pop up on the gauge. If the reading is lower than the recommended level, add air and check

again. Once the recommended pressure is reached, replace the valve cap.

• Check tire tread. Proper tread depth helps maintain traction, improves handling of the vehicle and prevents hydroplaning. To check it, insert the edge of a penny into the most worn groove of the tire tread, with Lincoln's head down and facing the driver. If the top of Lincoln's head is covered by tread, there is at least a minimum acceptable amount of tread. If the top of his head is visible at any point, it's time to replace the tire.

• Make it a habit. Technology can prepare young drivers for safer driving. For example, the free Tread Wisely app from Cooper Tire and NOYS, informs users how to check their tires using helpful videos and allows them to set automatic monthly reminders to perform tire checks. Other videos on the app instruct young drivers how to change a flat tire, what to do if they are in an accident, and how to handle other issues on the road. The app also includes a unique "I got there" feature, which reminds young drivers to let parents or friends know after they make it to their destination safely, using pre-loaded text messages.

"As a parent, you can't help but worry" says race car driver Johnny Unser, whose teen daughter Loni uses the Tread Wisely app. "However, you can give your kids the tools and information they need to succeed out there on the road."

The 1970's "Wonder Woman" T.V. series – which starred Lynda Carter as Wonder Woman/Diana Prince – was tongue-in-cheek, silly, campy and ridiculous

Wonder Woman (Gal Gadot) and Steve Trevor (Chris Pine) could not be more different from that of their 70's counterparts. For fans of gritty, immersive, epic superhero adventures, that's a very good thing.

Those T.V. shows from the 1960s and 1970s were goofy and family-friendly. They were kid-safe, with no need for adult supervision. In contrast, this new "Wonder Woman" is intended for a much more mature audience. It is a much darker place where we take threats seriously; suspend our reality within the complex plot with its many intricate, surprising twists and turns; develop deep, emotionally driven bonds with worthy protagonists; believe that conflict with, and fight-to-the-death opposition to, the antagonists is just and necessary; and revel in the fantastic special effects. Silly just would not cut it for mature adult audiences who seek to be immersed in an alternate, believable reality for the duration of this film.

This new "Wonder Woman" takes itself very seriously. It is a refreshing and much welcome reboot of that comical T.V. series from so long ago, worthy of its association with the other DC superheroes films, which we see briefly referenced in the opening credits.

This "Wonder Woman" has what serious fans of super heroes movies yearn to experience: a compelling script, high drama, protagonists who we care about, action, adventure, raw emotions, epic battle scenes with state-of-the-art special effects, fantasy, romance, occasional humor (which provides some emotional relief); and truly evil, despicable villains who pose a very real threat to the well being and the very lives of the protagonists. This cinematic reboot of "Wonder Woman" has it all.

Sailors, Soldier awarded for MEDEVAC efforts

PACIFIC OCEAN - Six Sailors and one Soldier stood proud on the flight deck of Ticonderoga-class guided-missile cruiser USS *Lake Erie* (CG 70), May 18, as they were presented Army Achievement Medals for their efforts during a medical evacuation (MEDEVAC) at sea.

Capt. Darren McPherson, *Lake Erie*'s commanding officer, and Army Col. Dennis H. Levesque, chief of staff, 8th Theater Sustainment Command, presented the medals.

"We didn't know we'd be receiving those medals," said Hospital Corpsman 3rd Class Benjamin Lariviere, from Standish, Maine. "It was a huge honor. It's not often you hear about Sailors receiving Army awards."

On May 15, after receiving the MEDEVAC request in the wee hours of the morning, *Lake Erie* dispatched an embarked helicopter assigned to "the Scorpions" of Helicopter Maritime Strike Squadron (HSM) 49 Det. 4 to airlift a sergeant aboard an Army logistics support vessel

(LSV), who was in need of medical support.

"It was a joint effort," said Lariviere. "Between the LSV crew and our crew, we were all in. I did what I was trained to do. But without the guidance of the other corpsmen and the airmen, who knows what would have happened?"

The aircrew was vital to all of this."

The patient was brought aboard *Lake Erie* and was assessed and treated for nearly 15 hours before being flown from the ship to Tripler Army Medical Center in Oahu, Hawaii.

"It felt good to be recognized for something that doesn't happen every day," said Naval Air Crewman 2nd Class Giles Alberts, from Lena, Wis.. "Receiving a medal from another branch is something I didn't expect and it's a bit surreal."

After making a brief stop in Hawaii, *Lake Erie* was rendered honors by the LSV they conducted the MEDEVAC with, as the ship departed Joint Base Pearl-Hickam.

"It was a moving moment and a touch of class," said McPherson. "It's not often we get to



operate with the Army while at sea. It was a show of respect. Col. Levesque and I were both impressed by the young men and women who work at our respective commands. We truly are all brothers and sisters in arms."

Lake Erie is currently underway on an independent deployment to the Western Pacific and Middle East in support of maritime security operations and theater cooperation efforts.

Jackson completes final contract trials

SAN DIEGO - Independence-variant littoral combat ship USS *Jackson* (LCS 6) completed Final Contract Trials (FCT) May 19.

Navy regulations require a final demonstration of ships' capabilities prior to the end of the contractor warranty period to determine if there are any defects, failures or deterioration other than that due to normal wear and tear. The trial, conducted by the Navy's Board of Inspection and Survey (INSURV), is part of a series of post-delivery tests and trials during which the ship and its major systems are exercised, tested and corrected as required.

"As the permanent crew for *Jackson*, I can't be more proud of our ship, her systems and my Sailors' performance during FCT," said Cmdr. Patrick Keller, commanding officer. "Our ship has gone through Full Ship Shock Trials, Combat Systems Ship Qualification Trials events, and now FCT, proving once again that she is ready for the next major evolution."

FCT evaluates the material condition and performance of the ship's major systems including main propulsion, ship control systems, combat systems, and damage control systems. Special evolutions demonstrated included the firing of the 57mm gun, maneuvering testing and launch and recovery of the embarked rigid hull inflatable boat.

"We worked hard during FCT, but it was also exciting because this is what we are trained to do," said Mineman 2nd Class Nathan Davis.

USS Gabrielle Giffords (LCS 10) on 'sailaway' before June 10 commissioning

MOBILE, Ala. - On a journey that began May 8 from here, the Navy's newest littoral combat ship, the future USS Gabrielle Giffords (LCS 10) is continuing her transit which will conclude with her commissioning site in Galveston, Texas, and eventually on to her new homeport in San Diego

The ship's commissioning is scheduled for June 10, after which she will begin her transit to Naval Base San Diego. As part of her sail around, Gabrielle Giffords is conducting regularly scheduled equipment and systems checks, training, visit several ports and transit through the Panama Canal.

"We are making the most of our sail around," said Cmdr. Keith Woodley, commanding officer and a native of St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands. "During the transit to San Diego we will be conducting routine maintenance checks and training. We will also begin our Combat Ship Systems Qualification Trials events which are designed to test the ship's ability to track and disable high-speed maneuvering surface targets and defeat long range anti-shipping air threats."

Gabrielle Giffords is the ninth littoral combat ship delivered to the Navy and the fifth LCS of the Independence variant. The Independence variant is noted for its unique hull, ability to operate at high speeds, and large flight deck size.

"We're pleased to receive the future USS Gabrielle Giffords into the LCS class," said Capt. Matthew J. Harrison, commander, Littoral Combat Ship Squadron 1 and a native of Columbia, Maryland. "Gabrielle Giffords will join her sister littoral combat ships in their homeport of San Diego in July and continue testing and training for future deployed operations."

LCS is a high-speed, agile, shallow draft, focused-mission surface combatant designed for operations in the littoral environment, yet fully capable of open ocean operations. LCS is complementary to the surface fleet, with the ability to counter and outpace evolving threats independently or within a network of surface combatants. Paired with advanced sonar and mine hunting capabilities, LCS provides a major contribution, as well as a more diverse set of options to commanders, across the spectrum of operations.



Padres bullpen is stellar in back-to-back wins over Cubs

The Padres have had a number of players step up during their back-to-back wins over the Chicago Cubs Monday and Tuesday.

Rookie right fielder Hunter Renfroe, for example, had the decisive hit in both games with a grand slam home run Monday and a tie-breaking, two-run double Tuesday.

Catcher Austin Hedges had a career-high four RBIs Tuesday with a two-run double and a two-run homer.

And right-hander Dinelson Lamet allowed two runs on five hits and a walk with eight strikeouts Tuesday night to run

his record to 2-0 in two starts while becoming only the eighth pitcher in Major League history to have eight strikeouts in each of his first two games.

Great performances. But no match for what the Padres bullpen did in the two wins.

Asked to work five innings Monday afternoon and four more Tuesday night, six relievers allowed only one hit over nine scoreless innings. They issued seven walks and hit two batters with nine strikeouts. But no Cub crossed the plate against the Padres bullpen in 5-2 and 6-2 win.

Left-hander Jose Torres worked both games, pitching a

total of 2 2/3 hitless innings. And right-hander Kirby Yates gave end-of-game pitchers Brad Hand and Brandon Maurer Tuesday off by working two innings.

Rookie Torres was the first reliever into both wins. He allowed two walks with a strikeout in two innings Monday. Tuesday night he hit a batter in two-thirds of an inning. Kevin Quackenbush followed Torres and issued two walks in 1 1/3 hitless innings

Yates gave up the hit, a single to the first Cub he faced (former Padre Jon Jay) Tuesday night. He then retired six straight Cubs to end the game, including four by strikeouts.

Hand worked 1 2/3 innings Tuesday night, hitting a batter while striking out two. Maurer struck out one in a perfect ninth to get his seventh save. Ryan Buchter also appeared for one-third of an inning Tuesday, although he walked the bases loaded before Hand killed the threat.

Note Worthy:

Lamet is 2-0 after two Major League starts. The 24-year-old has allowed three runs on eight

hits and three walks with 16 strikeouts in his first 10 Major League innings. He has exactly eight strikeouts in each of his first two Major League starts,

becoming only the 13th pitcher in Major League history to accomplish that feat . . . and the first since the Yankees' Masahiro Tanaka in 2014.

San Diego County Fair opens Friday through July 4

Yeehaw! There's a cattle drive mooovin' through downtown San Diego!

DEL MAR, Ca. (May 24, 2017) -- For the first time in at least a century, 200 cows will be led in a cattle drive through the streets of downtown San Diego starting at 8 a.m. on Saturday, June 3, as a celebration of both this year's San Diego County Fair, presented by Albertsons | Vons, and the 150th Anniversary of the historic Gaslamp District in downtown San Diego.

Once upon a time, cattle roamed all throughout Mission Valley and the downtown Gaslamp District which was known as "those streets just south of Broadway." But today, as San Diego County's population expands and creates a more urban environment, the chance to see cows wander the streets downtown, to hear dogs yapping and nipping at the herd and to see cowboys yelling "git along, little doggies," all the while skyscrapers loom overhead - hundreds of city slickers will have the chance to view from nearby. This will be

a special event indeed.

Forty cowboys will ride the perimeter of the herd with their cattle dogs, expertly keeping the cattle contained as the procession travels down the street at about four miles an hour. There is a Cattle Drive Boss who oversees the cowboys as they drive forward. It's not as easy as it looks, since it takes a lot of expert cattlemen to move hundreds of 700-pound animals together in an environment unfamiliar to them. "Keep 'em movin'" becomes a very important command, because if one cow stops on the trail, another will stop and then they

will start thinking about where they are and where they want to go. Cowboys are experienced at keeping their herd moving along at a nice, mellow pace.

The drive will begin about 8 a.m., from the staging area at North Harbor Drive and Pacific Highway. The herd will move past the San Diego Convention Center and 5th Avenue; then, the 200 cattle and nearly 50 cowboys will loop around and head back to 5th Avenue and turn right, into the historic Gaslamp District sign. They will continue to Market street and head back to Harbor Drive and back into their staging area.

There will be plenty of places for public viewing along the way, including the grass area of Ruocco Park, the grass area in front of Kansas City Barbeque for the beginning and end of the drive, as it will pass by it twice, all along Harbor Drive, and the pedestrian bridge that crosses over Harbor at Market Street. Public viewing on 5th Avenue is only encouraged from inside open restaurants/establishments, not from the sidewalks. Some Gaslamp businesses will allow patrons to sit on their patios and inside as the drive moves through. The cattle move through any given area very quickly, only tying up the roadway for a few minutes at a time.

The Fair opens at 4 p.m. on Friday, June 2 and runs through Tuesday, July 4; it is closed the first four Mondays and the first three Tuesdays. The San Diego County Fair is the largest annual event in San Diego County and one of the top 10 Fairs in the United States and Canada, drawing more than 1.6 million visitors annually. New 'Navy Cash' cards coming

Sailors and Marines will begin receiving new Navy Cash® cards starting summer 2017, as the afloat cashless program transitions to the new partners, Federal Reserve Bank of Boston (FRBB) and PNC Bank. The cards will have a different look, but will still work the same way. Until the new cards are received, Sailors and Marines should continue to use their current cards.

Cards will be distributed in phases aboard ship, making the transition as seamless as possible. The only difference Sailors will notice is the new artwork and that the new cards are issued by FRBB and PNC Bank representing Navy's transition to a new treasury agent.

The new cards will be white, featuring blue "NAVY CASH®" lettering and a fade of ships in the background. They will include the same chip and strip security protections just like the current Navy Cash® cards. The customer service phone numbers, email address, and the website address will remain unchanged to ensure a seamless customer experience.

In the next two years all Sailors and Marines will transition to a new card and the old cards will no longer be usable.



Nearly 100 pets are settling down into their new homes after a Memorial Day weekend adoption special waived fees to military members, their families and veterans.

An organization called Animals for Armed Forces picked up the adoption fees. County Animal Services added vaccinations, spay/neuter, a microchip, licensing and a free veterinary exam.

Michael Rodriguez of Spring Valley found out about the special Wednesday, scouted out the shelter in Bonita Thursday, bought leashes, beds and other doggie necessities, and was first in line for the military adoption special on Friday.

The 39-year-old Navy veteran even arrived early with his 2-year-old daughter in tow. He got just the dog he wanted: a 1-year-old dachshund poodle blend.

His wife had wanted a dachshund and his live-in sister-in-law had wanted a poodle.

"My wife calls me Dr. Doolittle because animals are

drawn to me," said Rodriguez. "This (promotion) could not be more perfect."

The pooch had come into the shelter with another dog, but that second one was adopted shortly afterward. The remaining dog began suffering serious separation issues. Shelter staff told Rodriguez this animal would need a lot of attention.

"From being in the military, I understand how it is to be isolated and lonely because you're away from home," said Rodriguez.

In the Navy, he was a personnel specialist on board U.S.S. Abraham Lincoln. Rodriguez left the Navy in 2006 but he still feels like something isn't quite right. Two weeks ago, a therapist told him to get a dog.

"I need that comfort and that companionship," said Rodriguez. "I get that from my wife, friends and family but it's on a different level with a dog."

While talking, the dog began whimpering and Rodriguez comforted his new pet.

"It's OK, it's OK," he said.

Rodriguez said he read up on the traits of these kinds of dogs.

"Once attached, they are loyal and they follow you," said Rodriguez. "That's the kind of person I am, loyal and true. And a coddler!"

Rodriguez says his new pet will also help him become more outgoing.

For his part, Rodriguez says he wants to do the best he can for his dog.

Sounds like a match.
