## Partial dry-dock collapse floods Navy ship under construction

DEFENSE NEWS - The Navy is assessing the damage after a partial dry-dock collapse at General Dynamics NASSCO shipyard sent seawater through the hull cuts into the expeditionary sea base Miguel Keith that is under construction there, according to a statement from Naval Sea Systems Command provided to Defense News.

The July 11 incident occurred after the barrier that keeps the water out of the dry dock collapsed, San Diego fire officials told ABC 10 News. There were no injuries.

The full extent of the damage caused is unknown, said NAVSEA spokeswoman Colleen O'Rourke, but the ship is stable.

"On July 11, General Dynamics National Steel and Shipbuilding Company (GD-NASSCO) reported a flooding incident in its graving dock where *Miguel Keith* (ESB 5) is currently under construction," the statement read. "The ship floated off the docking blocks and took on water through hull cuts that were made to support the ship's construction and outfitting.

"The extent of damage to the ship will not be known until NASSCO and Navy personnel can fully assess the situation. *Miguel Keith* is currently in a safe and stable condition and all personnel are safe and accounted for."

ESB ships are designed to support forward forces carrying cargo, fuel, vehicles and other heavy equipment.

## USS Montgomery completes Combat System Ship Qualification Trials

SAN DIEGO - Sailors aboard Independence variant littoral combat ship USS *Montgomery* (LCS 8) successfully completed Combat System Ship Qualification Trials (CSSQT), July 1.

During the qualification, the crew conducted several trials to validate the performance of their combat systems suite, involving firing exercises and using their 57mm gun against a fast attack craft. The exercise is designed to test the ship's ability to track and disable high-speed maneuvering surface targets.

"The entire *Montgomery* team has put a lot of hard work and dedication into completing all the required inspections and trials," said Cmdr. Wayne Liebold, commanding officer and a native of Leesburg, Ga. "I'm proud of their accomplishments and we look forward to bringing *Montgomery's* combat power to the Fleet as an operational asset."

The crew successfully completed each scenario and demonstrated the capabilities of the combat systems suite. The trials included demonstrations of the Automatic Launching of Expendables (ALEX) Decoy Launching System and 57mm Bofors Gun Weapons System.

"I'm proud of the accomplishments of *Montgomery* over the past few months," said Chief Fire Controlman Billy Coffelt, a native of Centerton, Ark. "CSSQT proved that the ship is effective conducting wartime operations under the control of these outstanding Sailors. It was an incredible display of our ship's combat lethality!"

With the trials finished, *Montgomery* will focus on training and certifying for deployment, as well as completing any required missions over the next year.

*Montgomery* is homeported in San Diego, and is undergoing routine maintenance and training in preparation for deployment.

Fast, maneuverable and networked surface-combatants, LCSs provide the required warfighting capabilities and operational flexibility to execute focused missions such as surface warfare, mine warfare and anti-submarine warfare.



# Army chooses Austin as site for Futures Command headquarters

WASHINGTON - Austin, Texas, will be the location for the headquarters of the new U.S. Army Futures Command, Army Secretary Mark T. Esper announced July 13.

Army Undersecretary Ryan D. McCarthy then explained the details. He said the process started with 150 metropolitan areas, narrowed down to five. Besides Austin, officials considered Boston; Minneapolis-St. Paul; Raleigh-Durham, N.C.; and Philadelphia.

McCarthy said he and an advance team visited each of those five cities and met with city leaders, congressional delegations, private-sector entities, and university faculty and staff. All of those, he said, were "tremendously welcoming and accommodating to our team."

He added that the choice was difficult, as all five had great qualities.

The criteria for selection included:

- Proximity to science, technology, engineering and math workers and industries;
- Proximity to private-sector innovation;
- Academic STEM and research and development investment;
- Quality of life;

-- Availability of cost and time assessment of civic support;

-- Mature entrepreneurial incubator hubs for access to talent, ideas and collaboration;-- Space and access to top-tier university science and engineering departments for collaboration on experiments, prototype concepts and systems;

-- Expandability of work space for other services and companies to join the effort;

-- Density of industry and academic talent; and

-- Cost of doing business to enable both new startups and to draw established firms.

The undersecretary said the type of urban ecosystem defined by the selection criteria is where innovation, networking and collaboration are happening daily.

"That ecosystem cannot be duplicated from behind the walls of traditional posts and forts," he said, adding that recognition of that concept is a radical change for the Army's culture.

The selection criteria evaluation process included use of an outside firm, validated with the Army's internal studies and analysis, as well as a federally-funded research and development center, he said.

A six-member team is en route to Austin to begin establishing initial operating capability at

Army Futures Command, McCarthy said. Within a year, full operating capability will be achieved, he said, with a headquarters staff of about 500.

McCarthy said that doesn't mean all 500 will be working out of a downtown office. He said that as full operating capability is achieved over the coming year, he envisions teams of soldiers and Army civilians working out of technology "incubator hubs" alongside entrepreneurs, scientists and researchers.

A four-star general to head the

command has been identified, but the officer's name has not yet made public, he said.

McCarthy said Army Futures Command will shepherd development of the service's six modernization priorities of improved long-range precision fires, a next-generation combat vehicle, future vertical lift platforms, a mobile and expeditionary Army network, air and missile defense capabilities and soldier lethality.

He said the eight cross-functional teams responsible now for moving those priorities forward will fall under the command.

Col. Patrick Seiber, communications director for Army Futures Command, said over the next year, a number of existing Army organizations are scheduled to transition from other commands to AFC. The Army Research, Development and Engineering Command is one example of an organization that eventually will realign under AFC, he said.


Army Research Laboratories, part of Army Materiel Command, also will realign to AFC, as will the Army Capabilities Integration Center, which now is part of Army Training and Doctrine Com-

mand. A number of acquisition and contracting elements that will fall under AFC, but those decisions are still being reviewed, he said.

While some existing Army organizations will be realigned under AFC, Seiber emphasized that those organizations, their employees and their facilities are expected to physically remain where they are now.

The changes, he said, are "a delayering or rewiring, so to speak, to streamline functions under one command, to get solutions faster and products out to the soldier faster," he said.

## U.S., Japanese, Indian forces begin annual mine countermeasures exercise

OMINATO, Japan - U.S. Navy mine countermeasure units, Japan Maritime Self Defense Force, MCM units, and Indian Navy explosive ordnance disposal units commenced 2JA mine countermeasure exercise 2018 near Ominato, Japan, on July 18.

2JA includes U.S. Navy, JMSDF, and Indian Navy forces. The exercise strengthens interoperability and increases proficiencies in mine countermeasure operations amongst regional allies and partners.

"This exercise allows us to flex our mine countermeasure muscles and improve interoperability with our JMSDF and Indian Navy teammates," said Rear Adm. Brad Cooper, commander, Amphibious Force 7th Fleet. "The mine countermeasure mission is hugely important to both military and civilian shipping from all nations in the Indo-Pacific region and keeping

waterways clear of mine threats is fundamental to national security and the free flow of trade."

During the exercise, participating units will practice unit-level mine countermeasures tactics to include using sonar equipment to detect mines. Explosive ordnance disposal unit personnel

will conduct dive operations in support of mine countermeasures efforts.

The exercise will culminate in a combined phase in which U.S. Navy and JMSDF will coordinate and communicate to ensure a safe route through simulated mines in one of the

designated exercise areas.

U.S. Navy units participating include USS Chief (MCM 14), Explosive Ordnance Disposal Mobile Unit (EODMU) 5, Helicopter Mine Countermeasures Squadron 14, and staff from Mine Countermeasures Squadron (MCMRON) 7.

Participating JMSDF assets include Mine Warfare Force (MWF); Commander, Mine Division 2 (CMD2); minesweeper tender JS Uruga (MST 463); two mine-sweep ocean ships JS Awaji (MSO 304) and JS Hirado (MSO 305); fifteen mine-sweep coastal ships; Helicopter Mine Warfare Squadron 111; four P-3C patrol aircraft and one P-1 patrol aircraft.

MCMRON 7 is forward deployed to Sasebo, Japan and consists of USS *Patriot* (MCM 7), USS *Pioneer* (MCM 9), USS *Warrior* (MCM 10), and USS *Chief* (MCM 14).

## Mattis commends Norway's commitment to global peace, security

WASHINGTON - Defense Secretary James Mattis hailed the strong bond between the United States and Norway and commended the Nordic nation for its commitment to global peace and security in Oslo, Norway, July 14.

The closeness is illustrated by the democratic ideals espoused in both nations' constitutions, a bond strengthened by some 5 million Americans who claim

Norwegian ancestry, Mattis said.

Mattis, who met with Norwegian Defense Minister Frank Bakke-Jense and Norwegian Foreign Affairs Minister Ine Eriksen Soreide, said the United States and Norway have steadily built the strong bond over more than a century.

"It's bolstered by strong shared values and our desire, our mutual desire for trans-Atlantic unity as

demonstrated by the importance our two nations place on democracy, on individual liberties and the rule of law," he said.

"In America, we do not take for granted the strong bond between our peoples," he added.

Mattis commended Norway for its recommitment at the NATO summit last week to spend 2 percent of its gross domestic product on defense. NATO members pledged at the

alliance's 2014 summit in Wales to invest 2 percent of their GDP in defense programs.

The commitment, Mattis said, "lends credence to the reality that NATO is stronger today than it was yesterday, stronger than it was a month ago, stronger today than it was a year ago."

Bakke-Jensen described the United States as Norway's "closest and most important ally," saying the relationship includes strong and broad defense cooperation. "Our soldiers operate together in conflict areas around the world, and they increasingly work together in Norway and the North Atlantic," he said.

Mattis recognized Norway for its commitment to global peace and security, which includes its support of NATO's Resolute Support mission in Afghanistan, and the coalition to defeat the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria.

"You generously contribute to global stability to increase support of NATO's Resolute Support mission in Afghanistan," he said. "Your nation's commitments to peacekeeping development are commendable," he said, "because as we all know you're a standard-bearer for the international responsibilities of peacekeeping, of development funding - all those kinds of things that ultimately, we stand for."

The professionalism, dedication and skill of the Norwegian forces have strengthened the defeat-ISIS coalition, Mattis remarked.

## USS Gerald R. Ford successfully sails into post-shakedown availability period

NORFOLK - The Navy's newest aircraft carrier, USS *Gerald R. Ford* (CVN 78), departed Naval Station Norfolk on July 15 to begin a post-shakedown availability (PSA) period at Newport News Shipbuilding in Newport News, Va.

As the ship closes in on one year since its commissioning, the first-in-class aircraft carrier has seen many 'firsts,' with the ship and crew exceeding expectations in some cases. Since first getting underway on her own power April 8, 2017, Ford has safely conducted 10 underway evolutions and completed all of the testing required prior to beginning the PSA.

"My team has completed a very important phase in Ford's lifecycle," said Ford's Commanding Officer, Capt. Richard McCormack. "The shakedown period was an opportunity for the Navy to run the ship through a rigorous set of operational tasks

and assess her performance. My team of talented Sailors, shipyard workers, and program engineers have learned a great deal from our time at sea and provided critical feedback on performance to Navy and industry leaders. We now enter a post-shakedown availability period to incorporate several design changes to correct performance deficiencies and complete the installation of other systems needed to ensure the ship, her embarked airwing and the strike group are ready to support national tasking when called upon by the President."

Following her delivery on May 31, 2017, the ship has operated for 81 days at sea during seven independent steaming events (ISE), supported by in-port Windows of Opportunity (WOO). *Gerald R. Ford* has also successfully completed fixed-wing aircraft/helicopter integration and compatibility testing, air traffic control center certification, JP-5 fuel sys-

tem certification, daytime and nighttime underway replenishment capability demonstrations, ship's defensive system demonstration, Dual Band Radar (DBR) testing, and propulsion plant operations.

One of the most rewarding aspects of bringing *Ford* to this point has been execution of the fleet's first shipboard Electromagnetic Aircraft Launching System (EMALS) launches. Ford's Air Department, combined with the efforts of Huntington Ingalls Newport News Shipbuilding and Naval Air Systems Command Joint Test Group, successfully executed complete system testing events for all 13 redesigned Aircraft Launch and Recovery Equipment weapon systems, including the first 747 shipboard landings - the first coming only six days following the ship's commissioning - utilizing the Advanced Arresting Gear (AAG), against a plan of approximately 400.

## DoD releases report on enhancing security, stability in Afghanistan

WASHINGTON - The Defense Department provided to the Congress July 3 its semiannual report titled "Enhancing Security and Stability in Afghanistan." Covering events from Dec. 1 to May 31, the report was submitted in accordance with requirements of the Fiscal 2015 National Defense Authorization Act.

"Our purpose in Afghanistan remains to prevent Afghanistan from again becoming a safe-haven from which terrorist groups can plan and execute attacks on the United States, or our allies and citizens abroad," officials said in a statement announcing the report's submission. "To accomplish this, we continue to support Afghanistan and train, advise and assist its military and police forces."

This reporting period marks the first campaign season to begin under the conditions-based South Asia Strategy announced by President Donald Trump in August. In February, U.S. Central Command designated Afghanistan as its main-effort mission and allocated additional combat enablers such as intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance assets; attack aviation; fire support; and medical evacuation assets to support Afghan national defense and security forces and coalition forces, officials said.

"The assets and authorities to implement the South Asia Strategy in Afghanistan are now in place and continue to generate optimism within the Afghan government and [the Afghan defense and security forces] that a political settlement with the Taliban is possible," the Pentagon statement said. "The key to success remains sustained military pressure against the Taliban in order to eliminate the idea that they can achieve their objectives through violent conflict. The targeted investment of U.S. assets and personnel have increased the lethality of the [Afghan forces] this fighting season."

At the second Kabul Peace Conference in February, Afghan President Ashraf Ghani offered peace negotiations without preconditions to the Taliban, an unprecedented initiative that opened the door for meaningful negotiations between the Afghan government and the Taliban.

During this reporting period, Afghan forces remained in control of all provincial capitals and quickly defeated the Taliban's attempt to take control of the provincial capital of Farah in May, the Pentagon statement said. The mild winter allowed for sustained military pressure against insurgent and terrorist forces and built positive momentum heading into the 2018 fighting season.

# Air Force recruiters learn about innovations for next-gen special ops Airmen

WASHINGTON - For the first time in the Defense Department, a series of career field specialties is using human performance monitoring and a data collection system, as well as specialized recruiters.

Because of high attrition rates in its special operations career fields - pararescue, combat controller, tactical air control party and special operations weather technicians - the Air Force stood up the 350th Battlefield Airman Training Squadron at Joint Base San Antonio-Lackland, and the 330th Recruiting Squadron at Joint Base San Antonio-Randolph in Texas. Recruiters also focus on the special operations support career fields: survival, evasion and resistance and explosive ordnance disposal.

Air Force Chief Master Sgt. Josh Smith, the special warfare preparatory course superintendent for the 350th BATS, has been a pararescuer, or PJ, for 25 years. He said his team was tasked to stand up the squadron within 121 days. They shadowed the Army's

and Navy's special operations programs and used their best practices to model this new program, he said.

The team received "amazing support" from Naval Special Warfare at Great Lakes Naval Training Command in Illinois, Smith said. "And we're using the same contract for our coaches, so some of their staff could help us set up the program here," he added. "It's been an amazing partnership between the two organizations."

## Pilot course

On June 5, 2017, the first battlefield airmen preparatory pilot course ran through its first eight-week iteration. Smith said the course's goal is to "create a program focused on creating that fitter, faster, stronger, more mentally resilient warfighter."

He said one area the Navy would like to increase training on is psychology. "We really try to focus on that communication, team building, the character tributes of leader, integrity, professionalism, trainability and teaching them how to improve in those areas," Smith said. "This generation knows how to text, but they need to work on communication."

Smith said the team was

tasked to improve production by 10 percent, but were able to improve it by 20 percent overall. They were able to eliminate the two-week pararescue development course, and tactical air control party candidates went from a 30 percent graduation rate to 66 percent.

Air Force Maj. Heath Kerns, 330th Recruiting Squadron commander and a special tactics officer, said the squadron pulled recruiters from 27 different squadrons across the Air Force who showed an aptitude and interest as well as other qualifications to head up this new squadron, specializing in recruiting for the three Air Force special forces career fields and its support career fields.

"Instead of worrying about 160 jobs, [our battlefield airmen recruiters] can get really smart on six jobs," Kerns said.

**The Air Force has learned that potential special operations recruits are not motivated in the same ways as recruits from the larger force. "They don't care about the benefits or the money. They care about the challenge," Kerns said.**

"I wanted to know, 'What's the hardest thing in the world I

could do?' I wanted to become the most elite [and] challenge myself in the worst ways possible," he said of his own motivation.

Kerns said the recruiters' mission is to scout, develop and guide the future warriors for their combat calling. With this new program, the recruiters work hand-in-hand with the squadron ahead of time and have developers, retired operators, who will work with the recruits to make sure they can pass the physical training test and be ready for battlefield airmen prep before arrival.

## Recruiter Training

To help recruiters understand what the course is like, about 90 of them attended a one-week version of the course, June 25-29.

"This week has been excellent training. Simple things like you normally swim with goggles, but now you have a face mask fogging up, and your nose isn't used to having dead space, so it's trying to breathe in but it's not [able to]," Kerns said.

"We can now absolutely understand that even though my applicant passed the test well in a different environment, he may show up here and freak out and his score may look bad. We understand the process now because we've lived it. It's going to change the way our recruiters go back and work with the candidates."

He said having the partnership with the active-duty community has also been helpful. "I reach out to my brothers and tell them, 'If you want me to replace you with quality people, I need you to provide these things.' It's been a great partnership," Kerns said.

Recruiters are critical be-

cause they're the first contact with candidates, Smith said. "If they're not sending the correct candidates," he added, "that will affect the capabilities of what will be produced out of this program."

## Cutting-edge Technology

The squadron uses many cutting-edge innovative technology systems. By January, the squadron will have a 55,000-square-foot smart gym with an indoor track with an LED lighted system called a rabbit. The gym will know when the students enter via a chip in their smart watches. The cardio equipment will read the chips as well. The weight equipment will have tablets with video cameras where the students will type in their student number and record their workout, and then the coaches will critique and send them a message if they did anything wrong in their techniques.

The squadron is the first in DoD to use a digital functional movement screening called DARI for all candidates. The camera system identifies joint mobility and strength imbalances of 28 movement patterns.

The first class had 14 candidates who were identified to be at high risk for injury, Smith said, and within 10 training days, 12 of the 14 were injured in the way the computer had predicted.

"For the next class, for those identified, we gave them homework," he said. "They wear these compression shirts and shorts that link to their tablets to show that they're doing the exercises for accountability. The injuries went down."

The students wear a harness with a Zephyr biomodule sensor, which measures their core body temperature throughout the day, as well as 44 individual post-training event data analytics that provide in-depth understanding of individual and group data on heart rates, calorie burns, estimated core temperatures, physiological and mechanical training. It provides feedback on windows of trainability in endurance, speed, power, strength and coordination.

The squadron's dietician is working with Google to implement an automated process of determining a candidate's food consumption by providing a machine-learning vision system to digitally track food. It will compare a trainee's performance calorie burn before and after meals for nutritional intake of actual calories consumed by taking a photo of the plate of food before and after the meal. The subject matter expert can address the disparities, Smith said.

## Social Security Matters

### Ask Rusty - Collecting Social Security while working

Dear Rusty: I'm trying to assist my spouse with her approaching age 62 when she can get her Social Security benefits. Currently she's working almost a full 40-hour week and her 2017 gross earnings were \$29,000. If she continues to work, she'll probably earn approximately \$29,500 in 2018. She's also contemplating beginning to work only part time, which will reduce her earnings to about 40 percent of what she currently earns. She is concerned that if she continues to work full time, she will have her monthly SS payment reduced significantly and will not recoup that difference. I understand that if you continue to work full time there will be some reduction in the monthly, but when you finally retire you will get the difference back at your full retirement age. Can you enlighten me/her? Signed: Helpful Husband



Dear Helpful: If your wife starts her Social Security benefits at age 62 and continues to work, she will be subject to Social Security's annual "earnings limit" (\$17,040 for 2018) which, if she exceeds, will result in Social Security withholding benefits of \$1 for every \$2 she earns over the limit. To use your example, if she earns \$29,500 in 2018 she will be \$12,460 over the limit and they will withhold all future benefits until they recover the \$6,230 that is owed from exceeding the limit (see my note below re: the first year of collecting). This will continue each year until the year she attains her full retirement age, or FRA, when the earnings limit goes way up (about 2 1/2 times the earlier limit) and the withholding is less (\$1 for every \$3 over the limit); once your wife reaches her full retirement age there is no earnings limit and they will re-compute her benefit amount giving her time credit for the number of months they withheld benefits due to exceeding the limit; they'll then raise her benefit amount as though she claimed benefits later than she actually did. So, over time, the higher benefit starting at her FRA could help her recoup some or all of the benefits withheld - but she doesn't get that withheld dollar amount back in a lump sum; they just increase her benefit amount at her full retirement age.

NOTE: There's a special rule which applies during the first year SS is claimed so, in your wife's case, if she claims benefits to start in June, instead of the annual earnings limit she'll be subject to a monthly earnings limit for the remainder of 2018. After her benefits start, her earnings limit will be \$1,420 per month for the rest of the year and if she exceeds that they will withhold benefits for a following month. The regular annual earnings limit will then go into effect the following year. Social Security requires that you inform them when you will exceed the earnings limit, but if you don't they will eventually catch up to you when your income tax return is filed. Note that Social Security recommends that you apply for benefits three months before you wish them to begin, so if your wife wishes to start her Social Security earlier than her full retirement age, when she applies for her benefits she should select the option to "Start My Benefits Now" in order to have them start as soon as possible.

## Eligible veterans can seek refund for taxes on disability severance payment

WASHINGTON - The Defense Department has identified more than 130,000 veterans who may be eligible for a refund for taxes paid on their disability severance payment, a DoD tax expert said.

Army Lt. Col. David Dulaney, the executive director for the Armed Forces Tax Council, said the department began mailing notices to veterans July 9.

The deadline to file for the refund is one year from the date of the Defense Department notice, or three years after the due date for filing the original return for the year the disability severance payment was made, or two years after the tax was paid for the year the disability severance payment was made, according to the IRS.

Affected veterans can submit a claim based on their actual disability severance payment by submitting to the IRS a completed Form 1040X, the Amended U.S. Individual Income Tax Return, Dulaney said.

The IRS also has approved a simplified method for obtaining the refund, in which veterans can claim the standard refund amount on Form 1040X based on when they received the disability severance payment. Those standard refund amounts are \$1,750 for tax years 1991 to

2005, \$2,400 for tax years 2006 to 2010, and \$3,200 for tax years 2011 to 2016.

Dulaney pointed out the disability severance payment is not taxable or subject to federal income tax withholding for a veteran meeting either of these criteria:

- The veteran has a combat-related injury or illness as determined by his or her military service at separation that resulted directly from armed conflict; took place while the member was engaged in extra-hazardous service; took place under conditions simulating war, including training exercises such as maneuvers; or was caused by an instrumentality of war.

- The veteran is receiving disability compensation from the Department of Veterans Affairs or has received notification from VA approving such compensation.

However, many of the veterans had taxes withheld, Dulaney said. The Combat-Injured Vet-

erans Tax Fairness Act of 2016 remedies that, he said. The act directed the secretary of defense


Estates or surviving spouses can file a claim on behalf of a veteran who is now deceased, the IRS explains on its website.

to identify disability severance payments paid after Jan. 17, 1991, that were included as taxable income.

Even if a veteran did not receive a letter from the Defense Department, the individual may still be eligible for a refund. Dulaney recommends visiting the IRS website and searching "combat injured veterans" for further information.

## Changes announced to Post-9/11 GI Bill transferability

Department of Defense released changes to department policy on the transfer by service members in the Uniformed Services of "Post-9/11 GI Bill" education benefits to eligible family member, July 12.

Effective July 12, 2019, eligibility to transfer those benefits will be limited to service members with less than 16 years of total service, active duty service and/or selected Reserves as applicable.

Previously, there were no restrictions on when service members could transfer education benefits to their family members. The provision for a Sailor to have at least six years of service to apply to transfer benefits remains unchanged.

"After a thorough review of the policy, we saw a need to focus on retention in a time of increased growth of the Armed Forces," said Stephanie Miller, Director of Accessions Policy, Office of the Secretary of Defense. "This change continues to allow career service members that earned this benefit to share it with their family members while they continue to serve." She added "this change is an important step to preserve the distinction of transferability as a retention incentive."

What does this mean for our Sailors?

The change will allow Sailors to retain their eligibility to transfer education benefits even if they have not served the entirety



of their obligated service commitment through no fault of their own. This means if a Sailor fails to fulfill their service obligation because of a "force shaping" event (such as officers involuntarily separated as a result of being twice passed over for promotion, or enlisted personnel involuntarily separated as a result of failure to meet minimum retention standards, such as high-year tenure) the transfer of benefits to a family member would not be impacted.

Exceptions that permitted service members with at least ten years of service to obligate less than four years if prevented by statute or policy from doing

so, such as enlisted high year tenure, have been cancelled. All approvals for transferability of Post-9/11 GI bill require a four-year commitment in the Armed Forces and, more importantly, the member must be eligible to be retained for four years from the date of election.

## INTERPERSONAL EDGE Alter your expectations of co-workers' workplace behavior

**Q:** I've been observing how often bad things happen to good people in business. When I started in my career I believed fairness ultimately prevailed on the job, but my faith in that concept is waning. You talk a lot in your column about having realistic expectations at work. What beliefs do you recommend to your clients about fairness in their career?

**A:** I strongly suggest to my clients that they toss the concept of fairness out the window. Many of my clients first see me because of unfair circumstances, and my clients are devastated or stunned. I point out that the problem is not the unfair circumstances but the unrealistic expectation my client had about his or her situation.

Obviously the emotional reactions we have when the world disappoints us are valid and important to experience. But, after we have acknowledged and felt our reactions we need to move into problem solving.

I joke with new clients that once they work with me they will never again have purely crappy problems happen to them. My new clients look excited before I add, "From now on you will only have interesting and educational crappy problems happen!"

No matter what adversity we experience at work, there are opportunities for learning. Many times the learning during an unfair experience is that our expectations were out of line with the reality of the business world.

Let me list just a few expectations that while understandable are not realistic. Most people will keep their word, be honest, be competent, have empathy, be kind, reward sacrifice, look out for you, be willing to see problems and see the big picture. If you hold out this high bar for everyone at your job, you will often be upset.

If instead you assume most of the time most people will do none of these things you will be more accurate and prepared to deal with normal workplace problems. Turns out the problem is not just that most people most of the time will disappoint your expectations but that you end up being ill-prepared to deal with reality.

Many clients have told me they don't enjoy looking at other people from this "cynical" viewpoint. New clients also spend quite a few sessions ranting about how wrong it is that other people refuse to conform to the behavior these clients feel entitled to.

So yes it is initially disappointing to take off your rose-colored glasses about what you expect from others and also what you feel others owe you. In the long run, however, there is great liberation and peace is making workplace plans that anticipate a far lower bar of behavior than you previously planned for.

When your new bar is on the floor you won't trip over your own inaccurate expectations. You can also celebrate and gravitate to people who exceed your low bar rather than feeling predictably outraged at what is actually pretty normal behavior for most people most of the time.

### The last word(s)

**Q:** I work with a guy who I think is smart but always talks in such a complicated way I can never understand him. Is there a way to get him to speak in a way I can understand? Also, why does he do this?

**A:** Yes, he'll speak in a simpler language if you are willing to admit confusion. Big, confusing words are often a cover for someone who does not in fact really understand what he or she is saying.

Available for both Android and Apple iOS devices, the app identifies regulations, instructions and references from a wide variety of sources and offers them in one easy-to-use app. It also includes information regarding assignments, retention, separation, standards of conduct and other useful information.




## F-35Bs leave with 13th MEU on first deployment with stateside unit

**MARINE CORPS TIMES** - The Navy's *Essex* Amphibious Ready Group and the 13th Marine Expeditionary Unit left San Diego recently with three ships, and is projected to carry out a deployment to the western Pacific and the Middle East. And they're bringing something else with them too: Marine Corps F-35Bs, which are leaving on their first deployment with a stateside unit.

"The *Essex* Amphibious Ready Group with embarked 13th Marine Expeditionary Unit got underway from San Diego," Pacific Fleet spokesman Capt. Charlie Brown said in a statement to United States Naval Institute News.

Further details about the nature of the deployment were not released due to operational security concerns.

The big deck amphibious assault ship *Essex*, amphibious transport dock *Anchorage* and dock landing ship *Rushmore* departed with a squadron of Marine F-35B Lightning II joint strike fighters from the "Wake Island Avengers" of Marine Fighter Attack Squadron 211, the official confirmed to USNI.

The Marine F-35Bs first deployment has been well anticipated in the weeks of training leading up to the ship-out date. Previous reporting by the *Marine Corps Times* shed light on the air platform's ability to support the

MEU's duties of engagement in humanitarian disasters, maritime incidents and potential combat operations.

The F-35B has been controversial from its inception largely in part due to its hefty \$100 million price tag and inconsistent performance reviews. However, its updated technology adds much needed capabilities to the ARG/MEU. Most of the Marines' strike inventory is comprised of the 30-plus-year-

old AV-8B Harrier II.

"With the new aircraft, we want to be able to capitalize on all the capability that aircraft has to bear, like multi-functional data links, how do we get that information from that airplane to the ship, so we can use it," Capt. Gerald Olin, Amphibious Squadron 1 commander and commodore of the *Essex* ARG, said in February. "That also gives me additional command-and-control capability."

## Inside Infantry Immersion Trainer

CAMP PENDLETON - "We're going condition one, move out!" said Marine Corps Cpl. James Kretchman, a squad leader with 2nd Battalion, 1st Marine Regiment, as he maneuvered his squad through the Infantry Immersion Trainer, or IIT, on Camp Pendleton July 10.

The 15th Marine Expeditionary Unit is currently executing Rim of the Pacific, or RIMPAC, exercise with 2nd Battalion, 1st Marine Regiment, also known as 2/1, taking the lead for training.

Throughout the week of July 9 to 11, U.S. Marines and partner forces from Canada and Mexico rely on the skills and experience developed in the three weeks of working together, as they tackle the IIT.

To complete this highly realistic, scenario-driven training, the Marines and soldiers need to be at peak performance as the IIT provides a chaotic environment complete with foreign sights, smells, sounds and civilian role players to intensify the training.

"It's easy for a lot of guys who are new to this to be distracted and become overwhelmed by the chaos of this training," Kretchman said. "Today's drills were very thorough, and my team learned a lot of important lessons from the realism presented by this type of scenario-based training. In these types of 360-degree environments, it's important that you stay cognizant of your surroundings and keep communication links strong."

By conducting training at the IIT, U.S. Marines and partner forces gain insight into the types of environments they may face

at some point in their careers, preparing them for a range of operations including urban territories where civilians are intermingled with hostiles.

By learning to professionally and diligently carry out their duties in these types of situations, they build upon their core infantry training, experience combat stressors and learn from their mistakes without the threat of real danger.

Following each iteration run by the service members, the staff at the IIT present video clips and a phase-by-phase breakdown of what they did well, and what they need to improve upon.

"A big difference between the training we received today and what we have done thus far is the role players," said Lance Cpl. Taylor Mckersie, a rifleman with 2/1. "The main goal for this type of situation, the main reason we would be doing any of this

is to give the civilians peace of mind that we're there to protect them."

RIMPAC fosters a capable and adaptive partnership for all the forces that participate. U.S. and Mexican forces ran through the trainer with an integrated squad, July 9. This brought a new level of difficulty as the service members had to break through language barriers and different techniques. They quickly learned that sign language is an international language and together, with a little practice and rudimentary ability to speak each other's language, they were able to successfully complete the training.

RIMPAC demonstrates the value of amphibious forces and provides high-value training for task-organized, highly capable Marine Air-Ground Task Forces enhancing the critical crisis response capability of U.S. forces and partners globally.

# RIMPAC mine warfare ops underway in SOCAL

SAN DIEGO - Commander Mine Warfare Task Force (CTF) 177, led by U.S. Navy Rear Adm. Dave Welch, commander, Naval Surface and Mine Warfighting Development Center (SMWDC) and the Navy's Global Mine Warfare Commander, kicked off the Southern California (SOCAL) portion of the Rim of the Pacific (RIMPAC) with mine warfare training operations which run from June 27 to Aug. 2.

CTF 177 is comprised of 26 units with approximately 1,100 personnel representing the United States, Australia, Canada, England, Japan, the Netherlands and New Zealand. It will conduct advanced mine warfare operations including mine countermeasure operations to support RIMPAC.

The mine warfare training operations are structured into five phases: staging and integration; force integration training; two simultaneous tactical phases; and a debrief and refurbishment period.

"The purpose of these operations is to increase capability and to build relationships with our partners. Trust isn't something you can surge, and it's critical that we maintain and develop these key relationships for the times we really need to rely on one another," said U.S. Navy Rear Adm. Dave Welch, commander, Naval Surface and Mine Warfighting Development Center (SMWDC) and the Navy's Global Mine Warfare Commander. "The training we will complete will increase capability, evaluate new and existing tactics, foster interoperability, and also provide us the opportunity to complete biennial certification of the U.S. Navy's deployable mine warfare battle staff."

SMWDC's Mine Warfare Battle Staff will complete Mine Warfare Commander biennial certification following Commander, U.S. 3rd Fleet's review of training objectives met throughout the exercise. The CTF 177 team will also conduct an assessment of mine countermeasure forces in confined waters and sea lines of commu-



nication. Helicopter Sea Combat Squadron (HSC) 21 is also slated to continue operational testing for MH-60S Seahawk Airborne Mine Countermeasure systems - Airborne Laser Mine Detection System (ALMDS) and Airborne Mine Neutralization System (AMNS) - a first for fleet exercises.

RIMPAC 2018 will also be the first time that U.S. Coast Guard Maritime Security Response Team West (MSRT-W) participates in RIMPAC SOCAL. Early in the exercise they conducted maritime interdiction operations with Royal Canadian Navy explosive ordnance disposal (EOD) technicians.

U.S. Navy, U.S. Coast Guard, Royal Australian Navy, Royal Canadian Navy, Royal Navy, Japanese Maritime Self Defense Force, the Royal Netherlands Navy and Royal New Zealand Navy personnel will participate

in the exercise. Commands participating include: Mine Countermeasures Squadron (MCMRON) 3, Mine Countermeasures Division (MCMDIV) 31, MSRT-W, the Australian Mine Warfare and Clearance Diving Squadron USS Ardent (MCM 12), USS Harpers Ferry (LSD 49), HMCS Whitehorse (MM 705), HMCS Yellowknife (MM 706), Helicopter Mine Countermeasures Squadron (HM) 14, and Helicopter Sea Combat Squadron (HSC) 21.

Twenty-five nations, 46 ships, five submarines, 200 aircraft, and 25,000 personnel are participating in RIMPAC from June 27 to Aug. 2 in and around the Hawaiian Islands and Southern California.

The world's largest international maritime exercise, RIMPAC provides a unique training opportunity while fostering and sustaining cooperative relationships among participants critical to ensuring the safety of sea lanes and security of the world's oceans. RIMPAC 2018 is the 26th exercise in the series that began in 1971.

## NPS launches interdisciplinary Data Science and Analytics Group

MONTEREY, Calif. - The Naval Postgraduate School (NPS) has just stood up a new interdisciplinary working group to streamline the way data science is developed, taught and shared at the university and beyond.

The formation of the Data Science and Analytics Group, or DSAG, announced June 22, will enable NPS faculty and students to transcend traditional academic boundaries to better provide education, research and advising across DOD in this critical area.

"The mission of the DSAG is to coordinate and focus the unique faculty talent, student population, infrastructure, relationships, and geography of NPS in order to provide an educational platform, research program, and advisory service to organizations within the Departments of the Navy and Defense that seek to make better decisions through data science," wrote Dr. Steven Lerman, NPS Provost and Academic Dean, in the campus-wide announcement.

"Through the DSAG, NPS will establish itself as the thought leader, educational nexus and primary research coordinator for data science and analytics in the DOD," added Dr. Robert Dell, a professor in the Operations Research department tasked with leading DSAG.

"There is an incredible demand for DSAG research and education," he said. "In many ways, [DSAG] is a response to the overwhelming number of calls we get from government agencies looking for help."

The pervasive growth of information technology over the past two decades has radically trans-

formed virtually every aspect of military affairs. When nearly everything is digitalized, effectively managing and interpreting massive amounts of data - collectively coined Big Data - has proven to be a daunting challenge.

Few organizations in the world collect more data than the DOD. Across disparate domains - intelligence, oceanography, personnel, logistics, cybersecurity, meteorology, acquisition, command and control, just to name a few - successful navigation of this data, and educating future leaders to do so, remains a critical challenge to U.S. national security.

DSAG will bring all this together. "As part of the Navy, NPS is uniquely positioned to provide much needed research, education and guidance in this field," Dell said. "There is so much more we can do to grow our capabilities."

NPS faculty across campus have been making significant data science and analytics research contributions for many years. Since 2013, the OR department in the Graduate School of Operational and Information Sciences has offered a track focused on data science, and since 2016, has added a graduate certificate in the discipline. "We have embraced the growing demands for data science and analytics, but OR by itself is too narrow," Dell said.

The founding of DSAG was introduced in NPS' new Strategic Plan: 2018-2023, which called for the establishment of a data science working group which could organize existing data sources, provide an analytic capability to take on some of the nation's most pressing issues, and cultivate the human capital necessary to integrate data science into future decision-making.



# AutoMatters & More: Consumer-oriented 'Ride & Drives'

Back before the big economic recession hit, auto manufacturers often used to host dedicated, standalone 'Ride & Drive' events, offering potential customers the opportunity to see, ride in and drive their vehicles in a controlled, safe environment, free of any of the sales pressure that they might experience at car dealerships. These events are still held, but they seem to be less frequent, and far less spectacular.

'Ride & Drives' tour the country, setting up for a few days on large paved areas in several cities. Back in 2005, General Motors had two very large, travelling auto shows – one for Chevrolet and Cadillac, and the other for Buick, Pontiac and GMC – complete with new model car reveals on a stage, a café, a professional drifting demonstration, and competitive brand test drives. Sadly, those big budget extravaganzas are long

gone. Today's 'Ride & Drives' are lean by comparison. Now, often, 'Ride & Drives' are part of formal auto shows.

For the standalone events, consumers go online to reserve well in advance. They arrive at the location at their appointed day and time, check in and then head over to an orientation – often in a large, temporary tent in a huge parking lot at a stadium – where they learn about what is in store for them.

There are all sorts of variations on the theme. Like GM, Toyota has been particularly creative in coming up with new activities that sometimes include

clever games and challenges, and prizes. Broadly, there are several elements including hospitality, information about the vehicles, street-type driving, higher performance driving and a survey, often accompanied by a parting gift.

Hospitality ranges from basic refreshments outside to elaborate, comfortable, carpeted lounges with leather furniture, catered food and premium bottled water presented in large, air-conditioned, building-like tents – often with show cars on display, like at an auto show.

At orientation we gather in a

large room, where we are given a hosted presentation about the vehicles, and perhaps a demonstration about some featured technology or other noteworthy characteristics. These may be in

the form of videos, informative graphics and physical demonstrations with actual vehicles – for example, to demonstrate safety technology that lets drivers "see" ahead in the dark or through fog.

The final step in the orientation is to tell us about the activities we are about to do, to experience the vehicles.

These driving experiences range from simple – with a small number of the manufacturers' vehicle models and basic driving

activities that usually include negotiating an autocross; to large and elaborate, where the manufacturer might come up with clever driving challenges and provide us with opportunities to evaluate not only

their vehicles but also competitors' vehicles for comparison.

While each of us wait for our turn to drive, our waiting areas typically include large graphics boards that briefly describe key features of the vehicles that we are about to drive.

An autocross is often utilized to enable participants to experience

the various driving capabilities of the vehicles. In an autocross, vehicles are driven somewhat aggressively, one at a time, around a challenging course delineated by traffic cones. Driving the course demonstrates each vehicle's acceleration, handling and braking, as might be experienced not only in everyday driving but also when it may be necessary to make emergency maneuvers on public roads.

At these events, participants are sometimes instructed by professional drivers in the basics of high performance driving. They may refer to a course map in what is called a 'chalk talk.' We either drive the vehicles on

our own, or accompanied by a staff member. We may also ride as passengers.

Occasionally the auto manufacturers stage timed autocross competitions for bragging rights or even prizes. Mazda, GM and BMW events come

to mind.

Courses are not always autocrosses. Some are just designed to give participants opportunities to casually drive the vehicles and experience their comfort, convenience and safety features. Other times drivers are set out on public roads with a route map, for an actual, real world street drive.



Simulated obstacles that may be found in off-road driving situations may be used to demonstrate off-road capable vehicles like Jeeps and Hummers.

As you can see, vehicle manufacturers' 'Ride & Drives' present great opportunities to check out new vehicles.

**STARTING THIS WEEK: "READY PLAYER ONE"**: Steven Spielberg clearly has retained his sense of fun as a moviemaker, if his version of a novel by Ernest Cline (who co-wrote the screenplay) is any indication - and it surely is, as it crams in every pop-culture reference of the past 30 years that it can, and then stuffs in some more. Tye Sheridan plays the story's young hero, a gamer seeking escape from a grim mid-21st century by tackling a video platform called OASIS. The person who conquers all the challenges it throws forth will win the fortune of its late co-creator (Mark Rylance, who won an Oscar for his earlier work with Spielberg in "Bridge of Spies"). The main obstacle is a businessman portrayed by Ben Mendelsohn, who deploys a video terror with the voice of actor-comedian T.J. Miller.
