

## Navy salutes our defenders on Law Enforcement Appreciation Day

WASHINGTON - Wherever you go in the Navy, you see them at the entry control points, in vehicles, patrolling the installation, and on the water protecting our ships and piers - master-at-arms and civilian Navy law enforcement professionals are on watch 24/7 protecting you.

The Navy joined the rest of America in saluting law enforcement professionals on National Law Enforcement Appreciation Day (L.E.A.D.), observed on Jan. 9.

The uniformed master-at-arms and civilian law enforcement professionals stand the watch around the clock every day of the year ensuring Navy assets, Sailors and their families remain safe to ensure the Navy is ready to protect the nation when needed.

"Military and civilian law enforcement personnel are key to CNIC's critical force protection mission," said Tim Alexander, Director of Operations for Navy Installations Command. "Our Navy exists to protect America from attack, but it's our Navy law enforcement professionals who help protect our Navy," he added.

"Force protection is the overarching mission for security personnel," said Ron Herb, Force Protection Program Director for CNIC. "Force protection has several subsets to include Law Enforcement, Physical Security, and anti-terrorism, all supporting the FP mission," Herb noted.

Uniformed master-at-arms and civilian law enforcement professionals perform anti-terrorism, force protection, physical security, and law enforcement duties on land and at sea. They operate force protection watercraft, direct investigations, control base access and supervise K-9 assets.

Navy law enforcement personnel conduct waterborne security patrols, protect oil platforms, and provide protection for high-ranking dignitaries and government officials. They perform security inspections, conduct K-9 explosive and narcotics detection missions, organize and train security personnel, operate brigs, and conduct crime prevention programs.


Homefront Celebration is for the spouses of active-duty, E1-E6 or post 9/11 wounded, ill or injured of all ranks.

## CNO visits Chinese counterpart in Beijing

BEIJING - Chief of Naval Operations (CNO) Adm. John Richardson met with People's Liberation Army (Navy) (PLA(N)) commander Vice Adm. Shen Jinlong in Beijing, Jan 14.

The two heads of navy discussed professional interactions at sea, specifically addressing risk reduction and adherence to rules of behavior.

"I appreciate the opportunity to visit China and to meet with Vice Adm. Shen in person," Richardson said. "There is no substitute for these types of face-to-face meetings. Given the responsibilities that our navies have in the larger nation to nation relationship, we must work together. These meetings

between senior leaders allow us to speak candidly about areas where we agree and about how to manage risk while we resolve our differences."

While in Beijing, Richardson also visited PLA(N) headquarters, the PLA(N) Research Academy and met with other senior Chinese defense officials of the Central Military Commission.

"The U.S. and its allies and partners have operated consistently in the region for the last 70 years with a focus on mutual security. This presence has supported exponential growth in prosperity for all," Richardson said. "Our vision of a free and open Indo-Pacific excludes no nation and we recognize that while our two nations may not always agree, it serves both our people's interests to engage where we can."

Richardson's visit continues with a stop in Nanjing, where he's scheduled to visit the PLA(N) Command College for a roundtable discussion.

## U.S.-Japan alliance remains cornerstone of peace in Asia, commander says

WASHINGTON - The U.S.-Japan alliance remains the cornerstone for peace and stability in Asia even as it has adapted to changing threats, the commander of U.S. Forces Japan said during a news conference at the Japan National Press Club in Tokyo Jan. 9.

Air Force Lt. Gen. Jerry P. Martinez said his 27 months in command of the 54,000 Americans who make up the joint U.S. force in the nation have been the honor of his life, and that he is extremely proud of the way American service members worked closely with members of the Japan Self-Defense Forces.

"Our alliance is built on shared values: respect for the rule of law and a commitment to freedom and prosperity for all," he said. "It's an alliance that fundamentally respects the sovereignty of other nations while resisting coercion and aggression in all forms."

The U.S.-Japan alliance was founded and remains as a "force for good and a champion for peace and security," the general said.

Though the security situation in Asia is becoming increasingly complex, Martinez said, the two allies are able to change and cope with the shifting realities. "We face shared security issues that demand continued close cooperation and flexibility to adapt to changing conditions," Martinez said.

Japan's leadership in Northwest Asia is vital, the general said.

The U.S. has worked closely with Japan to respond to North Korea's nuclear and ballistic missile provocations, he noted. "The United States and Japan have partnered with many other nations in the region to enforcement of United Nations Security Council resolutions aimed at monitoring ship-to-ship transfers of oil," he added.

U.S. forces have worked with Japanese forces to "operationalize" guidelines for defense cooperation established in 2015. This

cooperation runs the gamut from command posts to information and intelligence sharing to joint exercises.

Japanese self-defense forces have exercised alongside U.S. forces in the Philippines, Thailand and Guam, Martinez said.

U.S. Forces in Japan operate America's most advanced military capabilities, including F-35 joint strike fighters, to Global Hawk unmanned surveillance aircraft and amphibious assault ship USS *Wasp*.

But forces have to be postured correctly and must be ready, the general said, and he emphasized the necessity for American forces to train. "Our presence in Japan and the region is a deterrent against those countries who leverage coercion and intimidation to influence other nations economic, diplomatic and security decisions," he said. "We must remain ready to serve as a credible deterrent to fight and win if others close the path of aggression."

## Op-ed: U.S. needs more veterans in politics

FLEETRESERVEASSOCIATION - Forty years ago, military veterans made up roughly three-quarters of Congress. By 2017, the proportion had dwindled to fewer than one in five. The

number of veterans on Capitol Hill will dip slightly again next year, because of retirements - but the elections of 2018 were nonetheless a turning point of sorts. At least 170 veterans re-

ceived major-party nominations for national office and at least 75 won office. (The figures are estimates: There's no official tally.) Of these, at least 18 are new to Congress - the most in nearly a decade.

Maybe the new influx can give veterans' issues a bit more of the attention they deserve. For instance, health records at the Department of Veterans Affairs need to be more quickly brought into the digital age - an era that has in fact arrived, though not everywhere. Improving insurance coverage for reproductive health care and reforming the veterans' disability system would be welcome too. While campaigning, many of the veterans promised to improve the services' methods for dealing with sexual assaults. That's overdue.

Beyond veterans' particular interests, former service members would carry extra weight in pushing for a new legal authorization for America's sprawling conflicts against terrorism. The existing 2001 measure is badly out of date.

Veterans in larger numbers can't fix what ails the country - but one expects that, as a group, they'll bring discipline, duty and a commitment to country before politics. Congress has been lacking in those traits lately.

Americans should care about this.

Until an age of peace and harmony dawns - little sign of this yet - Congress needs the perspective and experience of former service members, particularly those who've served in the post-9/11 era. A shared background in the armed forces might help check the excessive partisanship that hobbles America's system of government. And with polls showing Congress to be deeply unpopular, an influx of members from the institution Americans continue to respect the most certainly can't hurt.

So it's good news that increasing numbers of the 3.3 million veterans who joined up after the Sept. 11 attacks are opting to take on "second service" in politics. Good, too, that the tally of female veterans is going up. Also worth noting: More than one-third of the veterans elected were Democrats, and they played a key role in flipping the House.



## Sarcasm won't give you what you want

*Q: I cannot believe half the stuff people pull. I try to stay quiet and then end up being snarky when I cannot stand it anymore. I've noticed people always get even when I am sarcastic. What is the alternative to being snarky?*

**A:** The alternative to being snarky is to say something that creates change through interpersonal skills. What inspires us to be snarky is a belief we are powerless. Discovering that there are tons of strategies and tools that can change what you do not want will reduce or eliminate your snarky tendencies.

Think of snark as an ineffective technique for creating change. Our immature self

thinks if we sarcastically blame or criticize people they will magically know what we want and be motivated to deliver our desires. We may repeatedly use sarcasm and be puzzled why all we create are more enemies.

The powerful first step is creating change is to admit we want something. Many people avoid the vulnerability of admitting we need anything from anyone, as we believe dependency is weak.

If you cannot admit you do indeed want things from others, you will be stuck with miserable circumstances. If you can explore what you want then that is the start of any useful negotiation.

Remember there are many

ways to create change if we communicate our interests. Knowing and stating we want more money, more training or specific projects gives others information

about how to make us happy.

If we only use sarcasm, everyone around us knows we are mad. However, these same people don't know, and now do not care, what we are seeking. If we shift from complaining to requesting and negotiating, we are much more likely to make ourselves happy.

Yes, I know there are readers out there thinking that it is

simply wrong that others cannot see what they want. The story in your head may be that you give so much that others should give more to you. Waiting for others

to give you what you want will just make you bitter and old.

If you shift from complaining to negotiating people are more likely to be charmed than alienated. Yes you will have to avoid venting all your frustration that no one is seeing and giving you what you want. Then again because everyone now knows what you want you've dramatically increased the odds of making yourself happy.



Have you ever had a bad mood you just couldn't shake? Everyone feels grouchy or irritable some days. But a bad mood or major mood swings that go on too long may signal a bigger problem. The good news is that certain healthy habits can help you boost your mood.

"Some people are more moody than other people. Normal mood actually varies from person to person," said Dr. Carlos Zarate, chief of National Institute of Health's mood disorders group.

That's because we all have different "temperaments," or combinations of personality traits that are biologically based. These are fairly stable over time.

"Considerable research shows that people really differ in their basic temperament," says Dr. Maria Kovacs, an NIH-funded psychologist at the University of Pittsburgh. "There are some people who temperamentally are always in a 'good' mood. And there are people who are temperamentally always in a 'bad' mood."



or how much alcohol you drink - play an important role, too.

"If you address those factors - have good diet, good exercise, good sleep - wake habits, regular activities, routines, and try to disconnect from work and other stressors - those do have beneficial effects on mood and keeping you healthy," Zarate says.

Other biological factors can affect your mood too, like hormones. Women may experience shifts in hormones during their menstrual cycles, pregnancy, and menopause that cause mood changes. Men can have decreases in testosterone as they age, which has been linked to depression.

Certain medical conditions, such as a vitamin deficiency, can make you feel "down" or lack energy. Mental health conditions like depression and bipolar disorder can also cause you to feel very sad and have low energy.

Other mental health conditions can cause mood issues as well

- for example, anxiety disorders, obsessive compulsive disorder, and personality disorders.

It's okay once in a while for people not to have a good mood, Zaratesaid. "Moods that fluctuate occasionally are a normal thing. It's when it's combined with other symptoms - like significant distress and/or impairment of function or relationships—that it becomes an issue."

People may not know when their mood has become a problem. "Friends and family members should be open and honest with each other and let them know what they're seeing," he says, "because it can lead to strain on family relationships, other relationships, or work issues."

"Mood is a normal part of life, and having emotions is a normal part of life," Kovacs says. "Sometimes you feel more negative than other times. That's not necessarily bad."

## Hundreds more active-duty troops may be sent to U.S.-Mexico border

MILITARY TIMES - U.S. officials say the Pentagon is finalizing plans that would send hundreds of additional active-duty troops to the U.S.-Mexico border for several more months to support the Department of Homeland Security.

The troops would install another 160 miles of concertina wire in Arizona and California.

Details are being worked out,

but the plan likely would extend the military's border mission though the end of September.

The mission is separate from President Donald Trump's campaign to build a border wall but is designed to bolster security.

Officials said Jan. 11 the installation of the wire barrier is not expected to take long, so troops doing that would be finished long before September.

There currently are 2,350 active-duty troops assigned to the border mission, which was slated to end Jan. 31.

The officials spoke on the condition of anonymity to discuss details not yet approved.

## New base order on trending harmful substances

CAMP PENDLETON - The human brain is wired to make a person repeat experiences that they enjoy. Unfortunately, 40-million Americans over the age of 12 abuse or are addicted to drugs, alcohol or nicotine. This is more than the number of Americans with cancer, diabetes and heart conditions.

Drug abuse occurs when a person takes legal or illegal substances in an unorthodox manner. In the case of prescribed medications, a person may take more than the dosage prescribed to them or use a family member or friend's prescription to satisfy their enjoyment or dependence of the effect. Drugs are commonly misused to ease stress, feel good, or avoid the realities of life.

Drug abusers can however, change their unhealthy habits or stop using altogether. Usually drug abusers only use drugs for certain occasions in their lives, but once addicted, medical assistance is needed to treat the abuse.

"Drugs can impair your ability to do your job and be a Marine. The whole section from private and up will suffer the reproductions." Said Staff Sgt. Phillip Williams, a substance abuse control officer here.

Disturbing trends have prompted leaders on Camp Pendleton to issue a new base order (CAMPENO 5355.1) regarding Salvia and other substances that aren't currently banned under the UCMJ or controlled substance act. As of Dec. 27, Marines utilizing or distributing these drugs will be subject to punitive or adverse administrative actions. This new order will ensure the health, fitness, safety, and the ability to conduct the mission while protecting the welfare of all service members aboard Camp Pendleton.

## NMCB-3 Seabees deploy to support ongoing Tinian recovery efforts

OKINAWA, Japan- Sixty Seabees assigned to Naval Mobile Construction Battalion (NMCB) 3 deployed to Tinian to assume charge of ongoing Tinian Defense Support of Civil Authorities (DSCA) relief efforts on the island from NMCB-1 during a relief in place/transfer of authority ceremony Jan. 9.

Tinian and Saipan are part of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands and were devastated by Super Typhoon Yutu, which struck Oct. 24. Super Typhoon Yutu was the second-strongest storm system to hit U.S. territory in recorded history, according to the NOAA.

"I feel incredibly excited and honored to be part of this mission," said Lt. Lawrence Burkart, officer in charge of NMCB-3, Detachment Tinian. "An unfortunate tragedy happened to the people of Tinian, and with us being Seabees deployed to the Indo Pacific Region, humanitarian aid and disaster relief are in our hierarchy of priorities, so it is something we have all trained and volunteered for."

## SWRMC completes ASTM G-67 testing

SAN DIEGO - Southwest Regional Maintenance Center (SWRMC) recently completed the first aluminum alloy degradation (ASTM G-67) test after receiving authorization to perform the testing locally in August.

The ASTM G-67 testing process is a standard test method for determining the susceptibility of certain aluminum alloys to cracking. The testing method involves exposing a piece of aluminum - in most cases, from a ship or ship's system - to nitric acid. The results show if the aluminum is degraded and susceptible to damage.

"Getting certified to perform this testing has been a long process for SWRMC," said Capt. David Hart, SWRMC's commanding officer. "We are very proud of our team for persisting on this course and providing this capability to the Fleet locally."




